REPORT ABOUT ACTIVITIES OF PALYANITSYA ASSOCIATION

Katowice, Poland

18.01.2023

Background

The Palyanitsya Association (the Association) was established on March 11, 2022 not very long after Russia on Feb 23, 2023 unleashed the war against Ukraine. The purpose of the Association is to gather funds from people who are not indifferent and deliver all necessities to the people of Ukraine, the Armed forces of Ukraine and territorial defence forces to help fight back the Russian aggression.

The association is registered and operating in Poland which is among the countries which help Ukraine the most; Poland had become a place where millions of Ukrainian citizens – mostly woman, children and elderly – find its new, but hopefully temporary, home for the time being.

The Association is collecting funds from the donors and – while being in contact with Ukrainian government bodies and military entities, volunteering organizations and our friends in Ukraine – purchase and delivers to Ukraine what is the most needed at any particular time where it's most needed.

Funds collected by the association

Since its inception and as of the date the Association has collected donations amounting to about **705.700,00 PLN**. The list of the donors consists of 4 legal entities and 20 natural persons. Almost all funds are being utilized rather quickly as we are keen to deliver help to Ukraine as soon as possible and as of the date of this report the remaining balance of the funds being hold at the account of the Association is around **18.000,00 PLN** (equivalent).

Purchases and donations made

During the period elapsed since inception of the Association and upto the date of this report the Association purchased and donated to the Armed forces of Ukraine and Territorial defence forces of Ukraine 7 trucks and cars of various models.

Except of the above said donations the Association was also purchasing and delivering to various military units the following products:

1. Emergent medicine products which help to save lives on the battle field
2. Surveillance, reconnaissance and communication equipment (optics, radios and accessories)
3. Unmanned flying vehicles (drones – DJI, Autel)
4. Winter uniforms, clothing and equipment

5. Electric generators

Altogether for purchased trucks/cars and goods – which all were donated to Ukraine – the Association spend about **611.898,00 PLN**.

Administrative expenses and taxes

The Association paid certain expenses connected with duties being performed – for example, fuels, banking services – and taxes (VAT). The total amount thereby paid as of the date of this report amounts to around **75.186,00 PLN**. As of the date the Association is claiming refund of VAT and import duty paid during import of UFV standing for about **15.600,00 PLN**; we expect that this amount to be refunded to the Association within the first half of the year 2023.

Other activities

Except of the activities mentioned hereabove the team of the Association on some occasions were participating in meeting and greeting activities, privately helping refugees arriving to Poland from Ukraine while they were making first steps, assisting them to travel further from the point of arrival and finding them home to live at.
